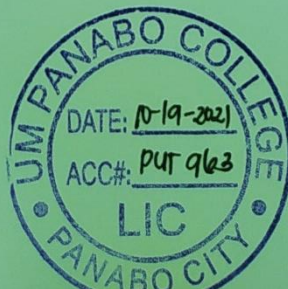





Abstract
